



Centennial Airport Noise Abatement Information Communications Plan

Centennial Airport in conjunction with the Centennial Airport Community Noise Roundtable maintains and publishes a set on Voluntary Noise Abatement Guidelines. The purpose of this document is to outline how noise abatement information is communicated to aircraft operators and tenants utilizing the airport.

Noise Abatement Information is posted in the following ways:

- A comprehensive Noise Abatement Guide is published and distributed to flight schools and Fixed Base Operators (FBOs).
- Noise Abatement Posters are displayed in flight schools, FBOs, and self-service fuel stations.
- Noise abatement information is published in digital formats that can be easily accessible on devices commonly used as electronic flight bags (EFB's) including phones, tablets, and computers

- Noise Abatement Information is published in Section 2 of the Chart Supplement, with graphical notices provided in Section 3 to assist non-local pilots in understanding noise abatement protocols.

Quarterly Safety & Noise Abatement Meetings:

In partnership with the FAA Air Traffic Control Tower, the Arapahoe County Public Airport Authority (ACPAA) hosts quarterly safety and noise abatement meetings. FAA Air Traffic Personnel discuss safety and operational factors at the airport, while Airport Authority staff cover noise mitigation efforts, current noise metrics, and noise abatement information. These meetings provide an open forum for discussion on noise abatement and help aircraft operators gain a deeper understanding of noise issues and potential mitigations at Centennial Airport.

Centennial Airport Community Noise Roundtable:

Established in May 2009, the Centennial Airport Community Noise Roundtable (CACNR) aims to reduce and mitigate noise impacts from users of Centennial Airport. The Roundtable consists of local elected officials, airport staff, community representatives, and airport users. CACNR serves as a platform for the public to engage with various stakeholders regarding the effects of airport noise. The Roundtable also contributes to the publication of the airport's Voluntary Noise Abatement Guidelines and provides a public forum to discuss and explore current and future noise abatement initiatives.

CANCR Study Group Committee:

Centennial Airport has also partnered with the FAA, flight schools, community representatives, and airport staff to form a study group focused on area specific noise abatement issues. The group's goal is to explore and implement mitigations to reduce overflights, specifically over the communities north of the airport. The update of Noise Abatement Information was a key recommendation from this group. They have also suggested several educational initiatives, which airport staff have pursued to enhance understanding of the Noise Abatement Guidelines and educate operators on responsible practices while operating out of one of the country's busiest general aviation airports.
